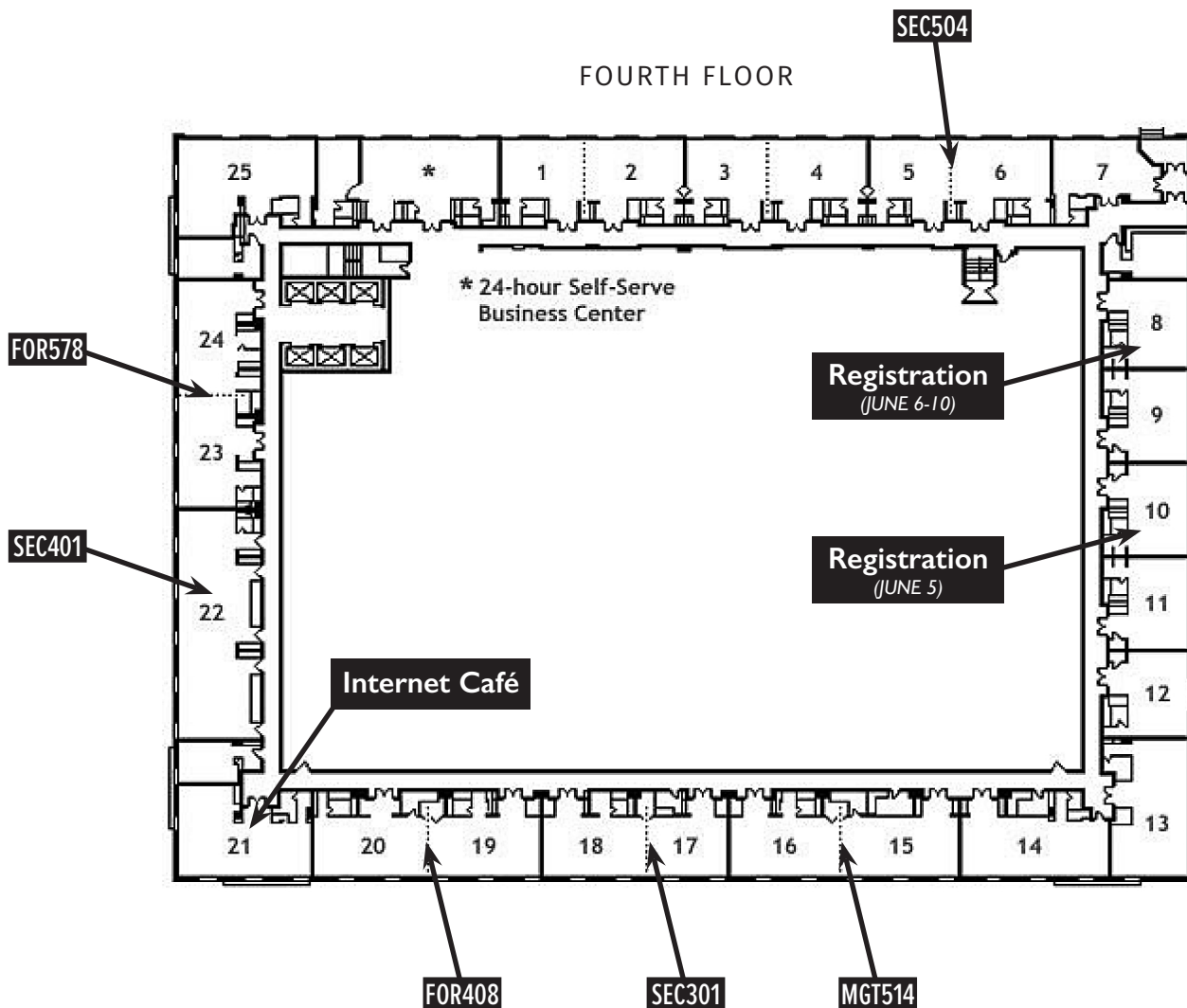
State of the Dark Web
